Re: Photo Opportunity with Minister David Piccini (Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks) to raise awareness about the Drinking Water Protection Zone road signs across Ontario.

What: Ontario's 19 Drinking Water Source Protection Committees and Conservation Ontario launched a new Drinking Water Source Water Protection outreach campaign earlier this month. Jim Hunt, Chair of the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region and Andy Mitchell, Chair of Conservation Ontario will meet with David Piccini, Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) for a photo opportunity at the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority to celebrate the Drinking Water Source Protection Road Sign campaign. Other guests will include Bob Sanderson, Mayor of Port Hope and Mark Lovshin, Vice Chair of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority.



Drinking Water Protection Zone Road Signs can be found along rural and urban municipal roads in addition to larger Provincial highways.

Over 1,700 road signs have been installed on both provincial highways and municipal roadways to raise awareness of nearby drinking water sources. These signs mark where there is a protection zone where extra protective measures are needed to reduce risk and keep municipal drinking water safe and clean.

Conservation authorities are key partners, along with local municipalities, in the <u>Ontario Drinking Water Source Protection Program</u> (MECP).

Background

One of the first ways we protect our municipal drinking water in Ontario is to protect the different sources of drinking water – lakes, rivers, streams and groundwater, from becoming contaminated or depleted. To help identify where some of our drinking water protection zones are located, the Province has developed road signs to show drinking water source protection zones.

Drinking water protection zones are areas, around municipal drinking water sources, where extra protective measures help to reduce risk and keep municipal drinking water safe and clean. Everyone plays a role in helping to protect our sources of drinking water.

Drinking Water Source Protection Zone Road Signs can be found along rural and urban municipal roads in addition to larger Provincial highways.

Over 1,700 road signs have been installed on both provincial highways and municipal roadways to raise awareness of nearby drinking water sources. These signs mark where there is a protection zone, which is defined as a certain amount of area around a surface water intake or well head that require specific protective measures for natural water sources, such as groundwater, lakes, or rivers that provide municipal drinking water.
