

# **Conservation** Authorities contribute to *Healthy Watersheds*

## CONSERVATION AUTHORITIES

Protect Ontarians and their property from flooding and erosion hazards. They protect natural areas and open space; restore and protect aquatic and natural habitats and provide recreational and educational opportunities to local residents.

More than 12 million people, approximately 90% of **Ontario's Population**, live in the watersheds managed by **Conservation Authorities** 



Are governed by a board of municipally appointed members, of whom are also elected municipal councillors.

Provide science-based advice and services within their watersheds. This includes review of municipal Official Plans and input into the planning processes of the majority of Ontario's municipalities.
