Re: Bill 229: Protect, Support and Recover from COVID-19 Act (Budget Measures), 2020 Schedule 6 – Conservation Authorities Act

At the November 19, 2020 regular meeting of the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority the Board received a presentation on the proposed amendments to the *Conservation Authorities Act* as found in Schedule 6 of Bill 229. The Board had a fulsome discussion about the proposed amendments and have directed that a letter be sent to the province outlining the Authority's concerns.

While some of the proposed amendments are positive, other amendments have significant implications, fundamently changing the role of a conservation authority and its ability to fulfill the purposes of the legislation.

Our most significant concerns are summarized as follows:

- The proposed amendments that reduce a conservation authority's role in plan review
  will have the detrimental affect of limiting an authority's ability to support
  municipalities to enhance and maintain a healthy natural environment, a critical
  attribute of any prosperous Ontario community.
- Several of the proposed section 28 permitting amendments will significantly reduce or impair a conservation authority's ability to protect people and property from flooding and other natural hazards.
- Many of the proposed amendments will have the affect of undermining accountability and by extension good governance.

We strongly urge the government to remove Schedule 6 from Bill 229.

We ask the government to engage conservation authorities and municipalities in a conversation on how best to achieve the policy outcomes it seeks. Any subsequent proposed legislative changes should be posted on the EBR for a sixty-day period to allow for a broad range of public input.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. We are available and willing to work with the province on this important matter.
